
PRESIDENTS MESSAGE



April 4, 2023

PRESIDENT GLINDA PARESO

Brenda Nichols moved we accept them and Joey Castellano seconded the motion. She then did the same for Wes Spinsic since he has also met the criteria and Brenda Nichols moved we accept him and Mike Frye seconded. A vote was taken and everyone was accepted for membership. Welcome to them all.

GOOD NEWS/SAD NEWS
