

Tri-City Corvette Club Meeting Minutes

May 2, 2023

PRESIDENT GLINDA PARESO

President, Glinda Pareso, called the meeting to order. Max Dawson offered an opening prayer. The membership recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag. There were approximately 58 members and 1 guest, Roy Cheramie in attendance as Glinda's referral. He owns a new C8 and was excited to share. Glinda then called for nominations to fill positions of our outgoing Vice President and 3 board positions.

Nominations were also made for David Dominguez and Donald Guest. Each declined the nomination.

Glinda reminded everyone that dues were due June 1, 2023, and could be paid on line if members choose. She also asked the membership to keep our members in their thoughts and prayers who are having serious health issues. Cathy Knott and Sharlene Hammond are still fighting their battle with cancer. Dave Pareso has had quite a complicated back surgery and will be returning for a second surgery on his back very soon. Shawn Bruno is having issues and is pursuing a diagnosis. We have several members recovering well from health issues. Mike White, Melvin DeVaugh, Wes Spincic, and Craig Horn are all recovering from different types of heart procedures. Liz Hanley has completed her radiation and is doing well.

OFFICER/BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

- VICE PRESIDENT ROGER ROSS: Vice President Roger Ross recognized our Member of the Month, Jane Barron. Jane does an outstanding job of putting the newsletter together, gathering information for the newsletter, and working every year at the car show with registrations. Thank you, Jane. Roger announced our referral program is going well with John Berry leading with 3 referrals and Terry Long as well as Glinda have one each. There are plenty of cards available and he urged everyone to participate. Roger reported the Poker Run was an awesome event with 53 members participating. Michael Meredith won the high poker hand, \$250.00, and immediately donated it to Jefferson County Welfare for the foster children in our area. Mike White won the low hand and received \$100.00. A really big thank you to Shawn and Rod for all of their planning and efforts. Roger reported on the past events during the month of March and please refer to the Vice Presidents letter in the Newsletter where he lists each event for the club members information.
- **SECRETARY LIZ HANLEY**: Liz Hanley informed the membership that the minutes of the last meeting were in the Newsletter and asked if the membership would like to have them read or was there a motion to accept the minutes as published. Roger moved we accept the minutes as published and Michael Frye seconded the motion. Motion carried. There was nothing more than a Sports Car magazine in the mail and Liz gave it to our guest.
- **TREASURER MONA BERRY**: Mona Berry gave a financial report and it was a very favorable one. We are well positioned to take care of all of our upcoming expenses and obligations.
- BOARD MEMBER & ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR JOHN BERRY: John Berry reported to the membership an overview of upcoming events. For a complete list of events, dates, locations etc. please see the event section in our newsletter and they are also posted on our website and our Facebook page.
- **BOARD MEMBER MICHAEL MERIDETH:** Michael Meredith had nothing new to report and thanked the membership for all they do for the foster kids in our community.
- **BOARD MEMBER COACH BURGESS:** Mike Burgess reported on the SETX Food Bank show that took place on the 28th and 29th of April. He recognized Patricia McCulley for her efforts in getting an 18 wheeler with 27,900 lbs. of food donated to the food bank. The truck was available for photos with our Corvettes on the 28th and the Show and Shine was held on the 29th at Market Basket in Port Neches. At the event, Coach reported we collected \$800.00 in cash donations and an additional 696 lbs. of food. This was a huge success and Coach thanked everyone who helped and/or participated.

• **BOARD MEMBER BRAD METZ:** Brad Metz was unable to attend but sent word that he is still working on items for the bucket list, silent auction, etc.

- **BOARD MEMBER JOHN DECKER:** John Decker told the membership that the Giving Fields would like for us to hold another event for them, and they are planning on having their lemonade stand again this August. He also informed us that the Journey Community Church Show & Shine will be on May 13, 2023. Their show benefits the Foster Closet in Hardin County. He reported that the last show, April 8,2023, had 18 cars, 7 of them Corvettes, even tho it was held on Easter.
- **BOARD MEMBER DAVE PARESO:** Dave Pareso was unable to attend due to illness, however his wife, Chris Pareso, gave his report. She informed us that the whole month of August is being devoted to Clear the Shelter by the Southeast Texas Humane Society. There will be a special Clear the Shelter event on 8/26/2023, and they would like for us to plan something for that date with them and to tour their new facility. More information will be forthcoming.
- PAST PRESIDENT & MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR MIKE WHITE: Mike White stated that the TCCC will receive credit for 124 nights at the hotel. He reminded us all that 5/4/23, is the night for putting together goodie bags. The bags themselves were provided by TFWG Insurance, Terry Cauthen. We appreciate that so much. The goodie bag will include a schedule of events this year. Mike asked if you have goodie bag items to give, see Patty Kupper. For room baskets, see Bobbie Johnstone. For silent auction or bucket list items, please get in touch with Willa or Mike White. Mike informed us that this year you can pay for items you purchase with a credit card. He instructed everyone on instructions of how to purchase on the website. On 5/5/23, volunteers will set up the parking lot at 8am. If weather permits, they will set up tents, etc. Also on 5/5/23, is our Hospitality Night in the Atrium at the Holiday Inn & Suites. This will include registration, food and drink for out of town guests and each guest gets one drink ticket provided by TCCC. There will be seating for approximately 80 people and we have asked Fuzzy's to provide enough food for 100. Fuzzy's will bring the food about 4:30 and we will begin serving around 6 pm. Please allow all guests to eat first before any club members to be sure we do not run out of food. Mike asked for more help parking cars. The Southeast Texas Veterans Service Group will present the colors, a 21 gun salute and the Pledge of Allegiance the morning of the show. Our board voted to pay them \$250.00 for their time and travel. Rod Johnstone also reported that Extreme Detail is closing their business for the day to allow them to come and wash out of town participants cars. They will be available for members also. Mike outlined the schedule of events for the day of the show. He thanked Bobbie Johnstone for taking care of the valve cover race and all the volunteers who make the show a success.

He also gave us information regarding the new E-Ray. He told us about it doing cyclones on ice. They demonstrated that on the ice rink at Rockefeller Square in New York. He reported it is extremely fast and he is sending a link to the website so everyone can check it out. TCCC was recognized for 100% membership in NCM and for our continuing donations and support. He informed us that the caravan is coming up in 2024, but now is the time to plan. Everyone can go to the NCM website and get all the information on the caravan. John Berry and Glenn will plan and coordinate for TCCC. He informed us that the Corvette plant tours are now open and as a side note, the Jim Beam distillery tour was super!
