September 6, 2022

#### PRESIDENT

John Berry led us in a prayer and everyone recited the Pledge of Allegiance. We had a guest speaker, Shari Pulliam, who is over the Jefferson County Child Welfare. She gave us staggering statistics regarding abused and neglected children in our county and in the state of Texas. She thanked TCCC for its generosity over the years and stated she hoped we would continue to support this cause. She thanked Andrea Johnson and Michael Meredith for serving on the local board and everyone for participating in the annual prom project. She reminded everyone that everything donated here, stays here. Roger thanked her for her time and because she had other commitments, she excused herself from the meeting. Roger stated we had 48 members present and three guests. Lisa Coon was one of the guests and Roger thanked her for the good job she was doing with food and the location for TCCC. Terry Long was also a guest as well as Jeff Curl. Roger stated that Jeff Curl had completed the criteria for membership and Roger Ross moved we accept him as a new member. Mike Frye seconded the motion and the motion passed. Roger asked the membership if they would like to have the October meeting at Texas Star Bar and Grill again. Everyone was in agreement and Lisa stated she could have a variety of dishes.

#### **GOOD NEWS/SAD NEWS**

#### **OFFICER/BOARD MEMBER REPORTS**

- SECRETARY LIZ HANLEY: Liz received several pieces of mail, thank you cards from The Giving Fields, Southeast Texas Food Bank, Jane Barron, and Irene and Isaac Barbosa. She stated that Jane had published the minutes on the website and asked if anyone had any changes. A motion to approve the minutes as published was made by Rod Johnstone and Bill Hanley seconded the motion. Liz reported she had also received a completed charity application from the Giving Fields. Coach Burgess moved we accept them as one of our charities and Michael Frye seconded the motion. There was no discussion and the motion passed.
- **TREASURER MONA BERRY**: Mona gave an overview of our finances and we are on track for this time of year to be able to meet our obligations.
- BOARD MEMBER JOHN BERRY: John reported that the event at The Giving Fields was a wonderful success with 14 Vettes and 22 people participating. Out of the \$3,387 raised, \$772 came from our members. He also reported that the run to Lake Arthur, LA was a great success with 18 Vettes and 33 members joining in on the good food and nice drive. He thanked Darrin Nepinsky for helping him on the run. He also reported on the Boy's Haven Hot Summer Nights Open Car Show. Randy Bland and John Decker took plaques for the C5 and C8 class. Our member, Dave Pareso, won more than \$500 in the split pot raffle. Several other past events were mentioned. Upcoming events include the run to Coushatta on 9/17/22. Rooms have been set aside and the room includes a lazy river pass and pool pass. Also mark calendars for the Journey Church Show and Shine on 9/17/22, as well as the Nederland Drag. Be sure and check the website for all the exciting events coming in September and October including our first ever Halloween Party on 10/29/22. Some events are scheduled for November including the bonfire at Bruno's Winery on 11/19/22, and the Blue Santa Toy Run Parade on 11/26/22. - **BOARD MEMBER COACH BURGESS:** Coach reported a donation to the SETX Food Bank from our membership of \$83.00 last month. He also informed everyone that a video had been produced highlighting what the food bank provides to the community and that he had given it to the board for review and they would decide how and when to present it to the membership.
- BOARD MEMBER JOHN DECKER: John was unable to attend.
- BOARD MEMBER DAVE PARESO: Dave had nothing new to report.
- PAST PRESIDENT MIKE WHITE: He mentioned that he, along with Terry Cauthen, had put the video from the NCM on The History of Service Stations on the website and it recognizes Glenn and Andrea Johnson for sponsoring the Education Segment. NCM also recognized Glenn as a past Chair for the BOD and as the current National Ambassador for TCCC of Southeast Texas. He discussed many bits of information regarding our 29th annual car show on May 6, 2023. He passed out sign up sheets for members to volunteer to help on various committees. We are increasing the registration fee by \$5.00 in all categories. There will be 31 classes and changes are being made as to how they are categorized, we are rearranging the set up for food, stage and parking, and instead of photos and plaques we will be giving t-shirts. Each registered participant will receive a ticket which they will have to present to receive a shirt. Our cost will be \$12.00 per shirt. Extra t-shirts will be \$25.00 each. Joe Gautreaux from ProScreen will be on site to make t-shirts. Participants can pick the color shirt they want with a decal designed by us and Joe. There will be a "Light Your Vette Up" show in the parking lot following hospitality night. This will be at no cost and it will be added to the car show agenda.

There were no reports from any other committee members at this time other than Rod Johnstone reminding membership to mark their calendars for the Poker Run which is planned for April 15, 2023.
